As a volunteer, you'll introduce girls to new experiences and help them unleash their inner G.I.R.L. (Go-getter, Innovator, Risk-taker, Leader) $^{\text{m}}$  to take the lead and change the world. You'll be their cheerleader, guide, and mentor, helping them develop crucial skills and confidence to launch them into a lifetime of leadership.

# Bronze Award

The Bronze Award recognizes a Junior Girl Scout who has gained leadership and planning skills required to follow through with a project that makes a positive difference in the community.





# **Junior Aide**

The Junior Aide Award represents active assistance as a Junior Girl Scout, helping Daisy or Brownie Girl Scouts complete one of their Journeys. Only Junior Girl Scouts can wear it. Place this award directly beneath the Bridge to Junior Girl Scouts Award.

#### **Silver Award**

The Silver Award recognizes a Cadette Girl Scout's accomplishments in Girl Scouting and community activities as she matures and works to better her life and the lives of others.





#### **Leadership in Action Award (LiA)**

Assist a Brownie group on one of their Journeys. There are three different LiA awards, one for each of the Journey series. You'll share your organizational skills, use one of your special talents, teach Brownies and reflect on your experience.





#### Program Aide (PA)

This award is earned by assisting younger girls by sharing your skills, passion, and experience over the course of six activity sessions.
