Girl Scout Video-Taking Tips: Capture Your Adventures on Film!

Videos are a fantastic way to share your Girl Scout experiences and show the fun moments from your activities. Here are some simple tips to help you take great videos:



PLAN YOUR SHOTS

Think about the story you want to tell. Are you capturing a special event? A fun project? A leadership moment? Plan what you want to film, but also leave space for spontaneous moments!

AIT,

Start with a wide shot to show the scene, then zoom in on important details or people.



HOLD THE CAMERA STEADY

Keep your camera steady to avoid shaky footage. Hold your phone with both hands or use a tripod if you have one.



CIP!

If you don't have a tripod, try bracing your elbows against your body or a surface to keep the camera steady.



FOCUS ON THE ACTION

Record what's happening! Whether it's a group working together, someone achieving something, or a special moment, make sure your video highlights the action.

CIP!

Keep the camera on the action for a few seconds so viewers can really see what's going on.



KEEP IT SHORT AND SWEET!

Videos don't need to be long! Focus on capturing the most exciting or meaningful moments, then stop. Short, engaging clips are better than long, drawn-out ones.

AIT,

Aim for 10-30 second clips that show the most important parts of the activity.

GOOD LIGHTING IS ESSENTIAL

Just like with photos, lighting is key. Try to film in natural light, and avoid filming with bright lights or windows directly behind people (this can make them hard to see).

TIP

If you're indoors, face toward the light to brighten up your video.



WATCH THE BACKGROUND

Make sure the background isn't too cluttered or distracting. You want the focus to be on the activity or person you're filming.



If the background is too busy, try changing your angle or moving to a different spot.



BE MINDFUL OF SOUND

Clear sound can make a huge difference in your video. Try to film in quieter places or make sure the people in your video speak loudly enough.



CIP!

If there's background noise, you can always add music or voiceovers later when editing.



HAVE FUN AND BE CREATIVE!

The best videos are the ones where you're enjoying the moment! Try to capture natural, fun moments and experiment with different angles or perspectives.



Mix up your shots - try filming from different angles, like close-ups, wide shots, or even from above.



EDIT YOUR VIDEO

After filming, you can trim your video to keep only the best parts. You can also add music, text, or effects if needed.

VIP!

Don't over-edit! Let the natural moments shine through.

Remember, practice makes perfect! Keep experimenting, and you'll get better at capturing your Girl Scout experiences in no time.
