Council Scheduled Booths

Cookie Booths are a great way to get out into the community and to help girls reach goals!

There are different types of Cookie Booths: **Council Scheduled Booths** and **Troop Scheduled Booths**— and now —**Family Cookie Booths!**

NEW THIS YEAR!

Now families have an opportunity to take part in the fun and learning of a cookie booth! Starting March 2, if there are open time slots at one of the council's pre-approved locations, your family can request a reservation.

Just like troop-run booths, Family Cookie Booths give Girl Scouts the chance to sell their cookies and connect with new customers at popular spots.

- **Family Cookie Booths** Open **March 2**.
- Work closely with your Troop Cookie Coordinators.
- Families will use the cookies from their Girl Scout's inventory.
- Use your girl's personal Digital Cookie Site (Do NOT use the troop site).
- See below for further guidelines.

How to sign up for a **Family Cookie Booth**—beginning **March 2**

1. Review the Cookie Booth Availability Report.
 - A current list will be available every Monday and Thursday on our website under [Cookie Resources > For Girls > Family Booths](#).
2. Send request to the Troop Cookie Coordinator
 - Indicate booth location, date and time.
 - Include a backup booth option in case first choice is taken, as booths fill quickly.
3. Troop Cookie Coordinator will:
 - Secure booth slots in eBudde following same steps as securing a Council Booth.
 - Confirm with family via email.



Family Cookie Booth Parameters:

- Refer to the [Using the Mobile App at a Cookie Booth](#) (pdf) for step by step instructions to process and review orders using the Digital Cookie App.
- Locations are reserved on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- Do not show up at a booth location unless you have received an email confirmation from your Troop Cookie Coordinator, stating that your booth slot has been secured.
- Family Cookie Booths **MUST** be operated by at least one Girl Scout and a minimum of one trusted adult.
- Any registered Girl Scouts in the family that are participating in the cookie program can be present and selling.
- Non-registered siblings/friends are not allowed to be at a Family Cookie Booth. This is driven by safety, insurance, and program participation guidance.
- Contact Troop Cookie Coordinator to cancel if you are unable to attend the booth. This will allow others to secure the spot as needed.
