Service Units

What is a Service Unit?

A service unit consists of all Girl Scout members including - troops, girls, volunteers, parents, and community members - that live in a geographic area.

Active service units are led by a **volunteer leadership team** consisting of a Manager, Treasurer, Fall Product Manager, and Cookie Manager. In addition to the leadership team additional volunteer positions are available such as Secretary, Event Coordinator, Volunteer Mentor, and Recruiter.



Why are Service Units important?

- ♥ **Service units serve as a liaison** between council and local Girl Scout members. Council staff and service unit volunteers work in partnership to support a strong Girl Scout community.
- ♥ **Service units enhance the girls' experiences.** Service units offer local girls opportunities to participate in events that connect with her larger Girl Scout sisterhood.
- ♥ **Service units serve as a support team for volunteers.** Service units provide ongoing support, learning and enrichment opportunities for volunteers. Service unit meetings provide the opportunity for all volunteers to connect and learn from each other, share community resources, and plan events and activities for all the girls in the area.
